School Profile



History:

Founded in 1931, Chongqing No.1 Middle School is one of the most prestigious middle schools in Chongqing, a southwest municipality with a population of over 30 million. The school has a long history and tradition of outstanding achievement. Directly under the supervision of Chongqing's Department of Education, the school is comprised of six large campuses, enrolling over 10,000 students and employing approximately 600 certified faculty members.

Chongqing No.1 International Studies School (CQ No.1 ISS) is the dedicated international campus of Chongqing No.1 Middle School. Established with a global mission in mind, the Board of Directors of Chongqing No.1 Middle School chartered CQ No.1 ISS in 2001 under the authority of Chongqing's Department of Education.

In the school's initial launch, it implemented the International Foundation Year (IFY) program, a one-year university preparatory course accredited by the Northern Consortium of the United Kingdom (NCUK), serving students with a conduit for matriculation in British and Australian universities. Class Size:

To ensure more personalized instruction, CQ No.1 ISS maintains a student-to-faculty ratio of 6:1. The maximum class size is 25 students, in line with the College Board recommendation.

Facilities:

The CQ No.1 ISS campus covers an area of over 200 acres. Campus facilities include multi-media classrooms, a multilingual library, and miscellaneous laboratories. An on-site testing center conforms to the standards of Cambridge International Examinations. Sports facilities include an indoor arena, outdoor track and field, Olympic-size swimming pool, as well as badminton, tennis, table tennis, and football facilities.

Accreditation:

The AP courses offered by our school are sanctioned and accredited by the College Board (school code: 694406). We have also been accredited by the Northern Consortium of the United Kingdom (NCUK), which consists of 17 UK universities (i.e., University of Bristol, University of Manchester, University of Birmingham, University of Sheffield) and 13 Australian universities (i.e., University of Adelaide, Australian National University). In addition, we have been accredited by Cambridge International Examinations to fully administer the AS and A-level programs (school code: CN844). We are also a registered member of Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS) and authorized center of Australian University Partners (AUP).

Admission Requirement:

Admission to CQ No.1 ISS is a three-part process. Students are required to have performed in the top 25 percentile of their previous middle school, to have successfully passed an Academic English and Mathematics entrance examination, and to have demonstrated proficiency in an English-language interview with a foreign faculty member.

Academic Calendar:

The academic school year is divided into two semesters of 20 weeks each. The first semester typically begins in early September and ends in late January. The second semester typically begins post-Spring Festival in February and ends in June. Students typically enroll in over ten subjects in each semester of Grades 1 and 2 and take as many as ten subjects during their final year.

Extra-Curricular Activities:

CQ No.1 ISS offers a wide variety of co-curricular activities, including organized clubs, student publications, visual and performing arts programs, and intramural sport teams. Under school coordination, there are numerous opportunities, both locally and outside China, for student participation in community service projects. The student body organizes over 30 different clubs in the school. These include the Model UN, Music Society, Drama Club, Literature Club, and Math Club.

The student union, together with DreamMaker Center, organizes large-scale student events, which in the past have included those shown on the left.

Academic Track Record:

The 2014 AP Class, our first cohort of AP graduates, has scored on average in the 80th percentile on the SAT I examination and the 65th percentile on the TOEFL iBT. One third of all students has been awarded scholarships, ranging from \$3,000 to \$20,000 per year. In 2014, 100% of graduates attended 4-year colleges.

Most graduates of the A-Level Classes started from 2011 have been admitted to reputable universities in the UK, Canada and Australia.

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
