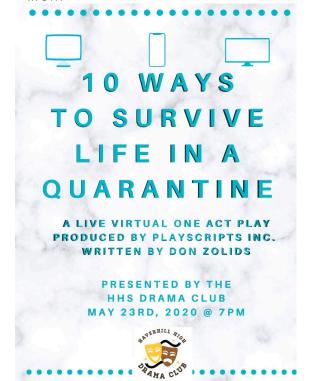

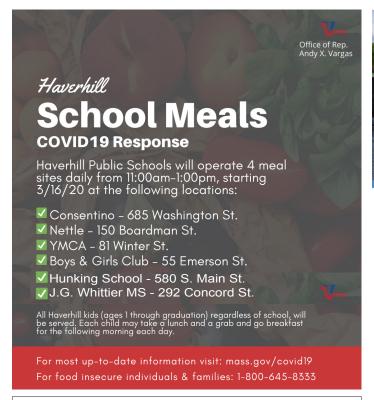

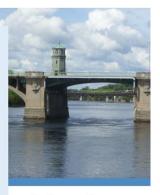

Managing Your Time While Learning Remotely

- 1) Create a daily schedule with consistent wake-up and sleep times.
- 2) Set goals for each week. What specific things do you want to achieve? How will you break your work down into smaller, manageable pieces? You can find an example weekly goals plan attached to this email.
- 3) Break your day into 30-minute or 1-hour increments, with a specific activity devoted to each one. We often think that we'll be more productive working in big chunks of time, but research shows the opposite is true. We tend to get more work done if we work in small bursts.
- 4) Act like you're going to school. Shower, get dressed, eat, and use the time you'd spend traveling to school to mentally get ready for your classes.
- 5) Don't forget to schedule intentional breaks for eating, exercise, and socializing. Do try to schedule these during low-energy times of the day. Research shows that sleep and exercise actually help you learn. Make time for them!
- 6) If you are having trouble creating a schedule, setting goals for yourself, or breaking down your work into manageable chunks, consider setting up an appointment with your guidance counselor.

How to Calculate Your GPA and Why It Matters

Coming soon - the school counseling department will conduct a short lesson with all scholars to review the process of calculating their own grade point average (GPA). Knowing what goes into your GPA is an important step in understanding how each and every grade you receive can impact you in the future. Your GPA tells colleges and future employers what kind of a scholar you are. We want our scholars to control their own stories and better understand how they can directly impact their own GPA throughout their high school experience.



Class Updates

Freshmen & Sophomores

School counselors have been rolling out future planning activities via our college and career website: Naviance.

Grade 9: This week we encourage scholars to complete the "Setting Goals" lesson. We must set goals before we can achieve them. This lesson provides scholars with a step-by-step guide to develop short and long-term goals.

Grade 10: This week we encourage scholars to complete the, "What's your Road?" lesson. Scholars will begin to explore their interests to identify possible careers; thus, broadening their scope of what is possible for their futures.

It is important to note that we know these are uncertain times, so while these lessons are not required for an academic grade, the enrichment they provide can be a great way to stay positive and future focused for when the world begins to feel a little more normal again.

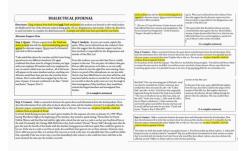

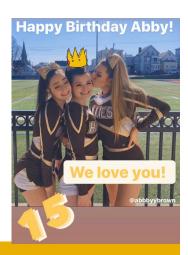

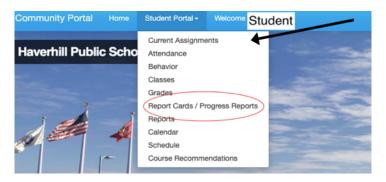
