The Special Meeting of the Haverhill School Committee was called to order at 5:02 p.m. by Mayor James Fiorentini, Chairperson. Present were: Mr. Raymond Sierpina; Mr. Shaun Toohey; Mr. Scott Wood; Mr. Joseph Bevilacqua; Attorney Paul Magliocchetti, Vice President; Ms. Kara Kosmes, Assistant Superintendent for Finance & Operations; Dr. Mary Malone, Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum & Instruction and Mr. James Scully, Superintendent of Schools. Mrs. Susan Danehy, President was recorded absent.

The Superintendent also asked for the public hearing on the budget to be opened.
