Communication and Reports:

Student Advisory Council Report - Haley Peabody.

Katherine Norphil informed members the picnic tables will be installed in the spring; a coffee house is being scheduled for March; and the Drama Club is working on the Putnam County Spelling Bee to be held in March. The Superintendent informed members all activities are rebroadcast on Cable Channel 99 daily.

Superintendent's Comments/Reports.

The Superintendent stated they have just received word from the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), which evaluates the condition and the American educational progress, has announced students will be tested and the honor to be recognized to participate.

Update on School Security

The Superintendent referenced the recent tragic incident and indicated he has enclosed the crisis team report which outlines the procedures staff follows in such a crisis. All schools have a controlled access prior to entering a building. Some systems are outdated and should be updated throughout the spring and summer months. Procedures have been tightened in all schools. They are working with the Police Department to aggressively protect the students and have a safe environment.

The requested meeting with the principals and committee relative to MCAS in each building shall be held this Saturday. The meeting will be video taped for a presentation to the public and should be two hours maximum.

First Draft of School Calendar 2013-2014

The Superintendent asked members to comment on the draft and inform him of any comments or changes by next week. The calendar should be finalized by the end of the month and passed on to parents for next year vacation information. It was requested to change the April 17 date for parent conferences, being the day before the spring vacation and Easter break. The Superintendent will review it.

Expansion of Athletic Program

The winter sport schedule has begun with participation in girls' basketball is low. Some of the programs are being expanded and being brought down to the middle schools as a feeder program. Two new sports, Crew and Girls Hockey, are being discussed as part of the expansion. Discussion as to funding, alumni support, and entering into partnerships with other schools are being considered.

Update on School Committee Goals

Mrs. Danehy is sending a communication to members asking them to review the current goals and possibly redoing some that have a long-term impact. Mrs. Danehy asked members to look at improving MCAS and Student Achievement which are mission driven and would like feedback on other areas to be focused on and included in these goals.

Mr. Bevilacqua

Commissioner's Visit

Mr. Bevilacqua reported on the recent visit to Tilton School and Haverhill High School. The commission met with teachers, administrators, principals and students to get a sense of what the students are learning. He was impressed with the students' positive attitudes, the opportunity to showcase the schools and to inform him of what is needed for additional support.

Use of Facilities

Mr. Wood expressed concerns relative to the inconsistency of charging and/or waiving fees to different organizations with Haverhill student participation. He indicated a recent incident when a custodian is on duty during basketball season weekday evenings which could be charged or waived for custodial services but not on weekends and questioned who receives the money for said service, what services are being provided, if there is a paper trail, and why is there a charge if a custodian is on duty. He indicated parents are providing the clean up of particular schools while the organization is being charged for said simple services. The Superintendent stated they have a paper trail for all revenues and will check into this concern and will comment back to the committee. There is no current policy written relative to fees. Mr. Wood asked for this to go to the Policy Subcommittee for a written policy to be developed to have consistency across the board.

Mr. Sierpina

Status of School Crisis Plan

This item was discussed previously in the meeting.

Professional Development Schedule

Dr. Malone referenced the schedule, which was included in members' packet and the strategies and text used for writing and mathematics. The Superintendent indicated successful strategies are broadcast weekly on Channel 99.

Map Testing Schedule

The schedule was included in members' packets. MAP testing is scheduled for September and January with kindergarten assessment in August and December. They are looking in doing a transcript for each child to get an accurate picture of each student. All students are tested prior to entering the high school.

Middle School Foreign Language at HHS [How is it doing]?

This report was included in the packet. Additional costs include bussing, which is budgeted to benefit the eight graders. They are looking at expanding the program with the state to offer more courses in the middle schools.

Role of "Race to the top project manager

The Superintendent referenced the nine pages of material and asked members to look at the DOE website to see the data submitted for all students.

Subcommittee Reports

Mayor Fiorentini and Mrs. Danehy updated members on the OPM selection committee's review of proposals for the Owner's Project Manager (OPM) for Hunking School. Presentations have been made the past two days with 16 applicants and have been narrowed down to five for further review Once an OPM is selected, the study will start, the study considers all possibilities as determination to renovate or demo p art of the build, to build on a new site or a new one, then a design selected and finally a vote from the citizens possibly the spring of 2014 with the earliest this November 2013. The Department of Revenue will not approve funding without debt exclusion. Once passed reimbursement starts at 67-68% with additional bonus points up to 72% and an opening date of the new building for the fall of 2017.
