Mayor Fiorentini called the meeting to order.

## 1. Approval of Meeting Minutes from April 26, 2016 SBC Meeting:

**MOTION:** made by Mr. DiBurro, seconded by Mr. Pacheco and approved unanimously, to approve the April 26, 2016 meeting minutes.

## 2. Construction Schedule Update:

NV5 summarized the progress made since the April 26, 2016 SBC meeting. The project is approximately 2/3 complete and is currently on schedule for substantial completion in January 2017. Safety and quality monitoring on the site continues to go well. Monthly meetings between the MSBA commissioning agent and the project team also continues to proceed according to schedule, with the first RTU in Area-A tentatively scheduled for startup in June. SDC and JCJ have been working in collaboration with the LEED consultant to track LEED certification points for this project; the school is currently on target for LEED Silver certification. JCJ is also working closely with the school department with regard to both furniture and also technology procurement, as those activities will commence over the summer. Exterior site and utility work will be re-commencing soon, with crews focusing on the grading, paving and curbing. The building envelope is complete, except for those areas currently being utilized for used for construction materials access. Interior work includes completion of the elevator installations, which await final inspection once tied into the building safety systems, along with installing interior finishes, such as flooring, painting, ceilings, glass, doors, tile and millwork in all areas.

## 3. <u>Invoice Approval:</u>

Before a vote was taken to approve these testing services, Mr. Pacheco inquired into the reason for the retests on the invoice. Mr. Cunniff reported that there were some minor issues with some of the windows and that SDC, the window sub-contractor and the thermal/moisture protection sub-contractor have been investigating and correcting any issues revealed during the windows testing and that retests have confidently garnered passing results.

An inquiry was made about the possibility of the projects future electric bills going through the City to avoid sales tax. Mr. Pacheco indicated that since the site needed a temporary electrical service, there has to be a new account created and therefore could not have been joined with the City. A possible solution was presented that the City could consider SDC's work as being done on the City's behalf and that would make it possible for them to bill the electrical bills through the City. Mr. Pacheco and Mr. DiBurro ended the discussion by agreeing to coordinate efforts on this matter after the SBC meeting.
