Scope:

This office was requested to collect bulk samples of materials that were previously identified as being suspect asbestos containing material under the AHERA regulation. Additional samples were collected by this office to bring the total number of samples collected per homogeneous material to a minimum of three. The samples were returned to the laboratory for analysis.

Analysis:

Analysis for the presence of asbestos was performed using Polarized Light Microscopy EPA/600/R-93/116, July 1993.

Of the samples collected, sample number 13248-33 was found to contain chrysotile. Materials containing <1% asbestos are not a regulated material and are not considered to be asbestos containing. All other homogeneous materials can be removed from the suspect materials list in the AHERA reports.
