OPPORTUNITY – ADMISSIONS POLICIES AND PRACTICES

OVERVIEW

A CVTE school/program's decision to employ a selective admissions process is a significant responsibility for the school with lasting impacts on applicants. Massachusetts [regulations](#) require all public schools, including CVTE schools, to admit students "without regard to race, color, sex, gender identity, religion, national origin, or sexual orientation," and [prohibit](#) CVTE schools from "discriminat[ing] in the enrollment of students with disabilities." Also, [guidance](#) from the U.S. Department of Education has clarified that schools "must have procedures to ensure that homeless children and youths who meet the relevant eligibility criteria do not face barriers to accessing academic and extracurricular activities, including...career and technical education...if such programs are available at the State or local levels." The CVTE [admissions regulations](#) include important guardrails to support CVTE schools/programs in providing equitable opportunities for students to access CVTE pathways.

REQUIREMENTS

All CVTE schools/programs approved under Chapter 74 **must**:

- Admit resident students who meet the minimum requirements for admission prior to accepting non-resident students seeking the same program.
- Condition admission on a student having been promoted to the grade that they have been admitted to enter.

All CVTE schools/programs approved under Chapter 74 **must** include in their admissions policy:

1. A description of the process for application and admission to the school, as well as admission to particular programs within the school, including any criteria, lotteries, or other processes to be used in selecting students;
2. A plan that includes deliberate, specific strategies to promote equal educational opportunities and attract, enroll, and retain a student population that, when compared to students in similar grades in sending districts, has a comparable academic and demographic profile;
3. A description of the exploratory program, if such program is required by [603 CMR 4.03\(4\)\(e\)](#); and
4. A process for prospective students and parents/guardians to appeal to the superintendent or their designee the decision to deny the prospective student admission to the school or program. The superintendent or their designee shall maintain documentation as to the specific admission requirements that were used to deny admission and shall provide such documentation to the Department or to the prospective student's parent/guardian upon request.

CVTE schools/programs that use selective criteria for admissions **must not**:

- Use criteria that have the effect of disproportionately excluding persons of a particular race, color, national origin, sex, gender identity, sexual orientation, religion, or disability unless they demonstrate that:
 - Such criteria have been validated as essential to participation in vocational programs; and
 - Alternative equally valid criteria that do not have such a disproportionate adverse effect are unavailable.

- See the [federal Guidelines](#) (34 CFR App'x B to Pt. 100) at Section IV(K).
- Apply criteria when there are fewer applicants than available seats.
- Consider excused absences.
- Consider a student's minor behavior or disciplinary infractions.
 - This means CVTE schools/programs cannot consider any student conduct other than infractions that resulted in suspensions or expulsion pursuant to [M.G.L. c.71, § 37H](#) or [M.G.L. c.71, § 37H-½](#), or resulted in suspension or expulsion for more than 10 days for a single infraction or cumulatively pursuant to [M.G.L. c.71, § 37H-¾](#).

Sending districts **must**:

- Offer opportunities to CVTE schools/programs to provide students with information on-site at their middle schools, as well as through mail and email.

Sending districts **must not**:

- Count middle school student tours of CVTE schools/programs during the school day as unexcused absences.
 - Provided that the CVTE school/program confirms the student's participation.
- Unreasonably withhold student access to CVTE school/program tours during the school day.

Important practices beginning with the 2021-22 school year:

- CVTE schools'/programs' board of trustees or school committee must **annually approve** any selective criteria to be used in admissions.
- The superintendent of the CVTE school/program must submit an **annual attestation** to the Department that their admissions policy complies with federal and state law and any relevant guidelines issued by the Department or the U.S. Department of Education.
- CVTE schools/programs must **submit** their admissions policy to the Department by October 1, 2021.
 - If a school/program subsequently revises its policy, they should re-submit it to the Department within 30 days.
 - The Department recommends that the submitted policy includes any applicable forms or documents used for admissions purposes, for example:
 - Application form
 - Interview questions
 - Score sheets
 - Materials used to train staff
 - Other supporting documents
- CVTE schools/programs must **maintain a record** of all students who apply for admission, enroll in the school, or are placed on a waitlist, and their score on admissions criteria, if used, and provide such information to the Department upon request.
- CVTE schools/programs must **annually publish** their admissions policy in their program of studies, post a copy on the school website, and provide a copy to each student applicant and their parent/guardian.
- CVTE schools/programs must ensure that all admissions materials are in **both English and the primary language of the home**, if such primary language is other than English.

NOTE FOR NON-CHAPTER 74 (PERKINS) PROGRAMS

Although the Department’s admissions regulation applies to Chapter 74 state-approved programs, Perkins programs must comply with Massachusetts [regulations](#) concerning equal educational opportunities, and admit students “without regard to race, color, sex, gender identity, religion, national origin, or sexual orientation,” and may not [discriminate](#) “in the enrollment of students with disabilities.” Further, Perkins programs are subject to the federal [Guidelines for Vocational Education Programs](#), which state in section IV.A. that “[c]riteria controlling student eligibility for admission to vocational education schools, facilities and programs may not unlawfully discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, or handicap. A recipient may not develop, impose, maintain, approve, or implement such discriminatory admissions criteria.”

CONSIDERATIONS

IF SEEKING TO IMPLEMENT A SELECTIVE PROCESS

- Before adopting selective criteria, admissions directors are urged to provide guidance to those involved in the admissions process on implicit bias and best practices to avoid it.
- Admissions practices that promote sufficient inter-rater reliability (consistency of scoring) among those who score applicants will help CVTE schools/programs avoid issues of subjectivity and potential for bias.
- Below is a series of questions that may help guide CVTE schools/programs as they set or revise their admissions policies:
 - What factors, if any, does the CVTE school/program find essential for students to participate in CVTE?
 - What indicators best demonstrate that an applicant meets these essential factors?
 - Does the CVTE school/program already have evidence that these indicators disproportionately exclude protected classes of students?
 - i.e., on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, gender identity, sexual orientation, religion, or disability.
 - What alternative criteria has the CVTE school/program considered?
 - How is the CVTE school/program training admissions staff on issues like implicit bias?
 - If the CVTE school/program assigns point values to applicants, how are tied scores resolved?
 - If the CVTE school/program requires applicants to attend interviews or functions outside of regular school hours or away from the applicants’ schools, what arrangements has the CVTE school/program made for transportation?

In addition to this application form, the applicant's guidance counselor will submit academic, attendance and discipline records to be used as a basis for admission. For fall admission, this would be terms 1 & 2 of the current school year and terms 1-4 of the previous school year. In addition to grades, attendance and discipline/conduct, the guidance counselor's recommendation will be used. A fifth criteria consisting of an interview with the applicant will also be used.

The application process is:

1. Fill out and return the application by February 25th.
2. Request (a) academic, attendance and discipline records and (b) a guidance counselor recommendation.
3. A representative from Haverhill High School will contact you to schedule a personal interview.
4. Admission decisions will be sent out according to the date specified on the Haverhill High School calendar.

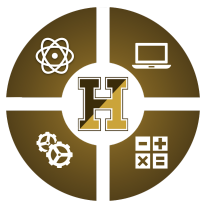

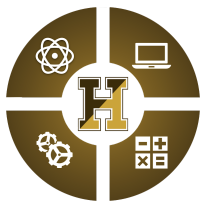

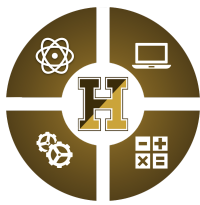

Neither a student's disability nor the primary language of their home will have any effect on their admission to Haverhill High School's CTE/CVTE programs.

Consistent with Massachusetts 603 CMR 4.03, Haverhill High School's plan includes "deliberate, specific strategies to promote equal educational opportunities and attract, enroll, and retain a student population that, when compared to students in similar grades in sending districts, has a comparable academic and demographic profile."

We are Hillies, working together to build a stronger community. Haverhill is a large ethnically diverse gateway city. The Northeast Regional Blueprint identifies large labor gaps in the STEM workforce. Businesses are reporting that minorities and those in nontraditional gender roles are underrepresented in the STEM workforce. Currently our community and education system are not meeting these regional employment demands leaving businesses and organizations struggling to fill positions. Our scholars need the STEM and workplace readiness skills necessary to take advantage of these livable wage employment opportunities.

In order to meet the diverse needs of our scholars, families, and the broader community, Haverhill High School worked with parents, guardians, students, faculty, Career Technical Education (CTE) Program Advisory

Committees, post-secondary institutions and community organizations to develop a mission where all students can succeed. Stakeholders identified the following priorities: to provide equitable access to options and opportunities; to create a welcoming and supportive environment and provide academic, language, social emotional, peer and family support.

Haverhill High School's mission is to ensure that each learner meets or exceeds rigorous academic standards to become a citizen with the skills necessary to solve problems and meet 21st century academic, social, and civic expectations. Creating a culture that celebrates individual success is imperative for engaging all scholars in accessible, equitable, and meaningful learning experiences. As Hillies, we value inclusivity, achievement, and authentic learning that promotes pride in ourselves and in our community. Our main goal is to ensure that each student develops integrity, motivation, and self-confidence to succeed in the global community. In order to achieve this mission, it is important that we share a commitment to a common set of expectations. In order to fulfill our mission and the expectations of our school by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the City of Haverhill, a safe, orderly, and welcoming school environment will be necessary. Creating this environment requires the efforts of every member of our community - our families, staff, faculty, administration and, most importantly, our students.

Haverhill High School's CTE Equity Plan follows the mission of Haverhill High School. The community is in need of a skilled, ethnically diverse and gender balanced STEM workforce. Scholars are in need of the skills necessary to succeed in livable wage STEM careers. In response to these needs Haverhill High School, in collaboration with community partners, developed five STEM Career Technical Education Programs. These programs will provide students with the foundational skills and certifications to pursue careers in high demand livable wage professions.

In support of equitable access and retention in CTE programming:

- 1. In support of non-traditional gender enrollment and ethnic diversity in CTE programs, Haverhill High School brings student representatives reflective of the district's demographic profile to the middle schools for recruiting events. Ethnically diverse and non-traditional gender students are reflected in recruiting materials such as posters, mailers, and videos.*
- 2. HHS actively seeks out opportunities for diverse representation in our CTE curriculum, welcoming and awareness events, guest speakers, internships, job opportunities, and partnerships with community organizations. Students see themselves reflected in their community, in real-time, print and media.*
- 3. In order to maximize student retention, HHS provides wrap around services and academic support to all students.*
- 4. Haverhill High School employs bilingual staff who work closely with ELL CTE students, families, teachers, and administrators to create a welcoming and supportive environment, assist with recruiting, translate documents, support students throughout the application process, provide classroom support for struggling learners and after school academic assistance, and prepare students for work based learning opportunities. HHS implements targeted recruiting strategies and supports struggling learners and their families throughout their CTE experience and beyond (CTE application, program completion and post-secondary planning). Staff coordinates academic, language, social emotional and peer support. HHS also works closely with middle school guidance counselors, ELL parent liaisons and ETFs to create High School CTE Transition Plans for struggling learners including English Language Learners and students on IEPs.*

As outcomes, this equity plan will provide:

- students and families a welcoming and supportive environment*
- an ethnically diverse and gender balanced CTE program enrollment reflective of the HHS student body*
- workplace readiness and industry skills and certifications*
- academic, language, social emotional and peer support*
- pathways to post-secondary training, education and or employment in livable wage careers*

- *a more diverse and gender balanced STEM workforce*

Per DESE requirements, this policy will be approved annually by the Haverhill Public School Committee.

III ELIGIBILITY

Any current 8th or 9th grade student who is a resident of Haverhill may apply for fall admission or admissions during the school year to one of Haverhill High School's CTE Programs subject to availability of openings. Students may only be admitted to one of HHS's CTE programs if they have been promoted to the grade they are seeking to enter, so students should be aware that their admission is conditional—if they are not ultimately promoted to enter the grade they have applied for, their admission will be rescinded. Resident students who apply for admission shall be admitted prior to acceptance of any non-resident students seeking the same program.

NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS:

Non-resident students are eligible to apply for fall admission or admission during the school year, provided they apply for and are accepted for inter-district school choice and are entering grade 9 or 10. Both resident and non-resident students will be evaluated using the selection criteria contained in this Admissions Policy. Haverhill High School shall admit resident students who meet the minimum requirements for admissions prior to acceptance of any non-resident students.

HOMESCHOOLED STUDENTS:

Homeschool applicants may apply to attend Haverhill High School full-time and will be subject to the same admissions standards as other applicants.

TRANSFER STUDENTS:

Students already participating in Chapter 74 programs at another school may apply for admission to Haverhill High School and will be subject to the same admissions standards as other applicants.

SCHOOL CHOICE:

Haverhill High School will follow the School Committee decision regarding school choice for the 2022/23 school year. The inter-district school choice program, [M.G.L. c. 76, § 12B](#), allows parents/guardians to send their children to schools in communities other than the city or town in which they reside.

If the School Committee decides that Haverhill High School is participating in school choice program then:

IV ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

It is the responsibility of Haverhill Public School District Superintendent to supervise the administration of the policies and procedures used to admit and enroll students, consistent with all applicable laws, regulations, and guidance.

V ADMISSIONS COMMUNICATION POLICIES

Haverhill High School maintains a calendar of events on the HHS website where it provides information on the admissions process, as well as other information about its programs. Students and their families can request hard copies of the calendar by emailing the CTE Office at cte@haverhill-ps.org.

Haverhill High School also shares recruitment information with potential applicants in the following ways:

- Informational slide presentations will be provided to eighth grade classes in local schools. Recruiting materials and presentations will be provided to students and families in their native language.
- Prospective students and their parent(s)/guardian(s) have an opportunity (depending on COVID restrictions) to attend a virtual or in person information session to learn about all Career Technical Education programs and speak with teachers and administrators.
- During the fall, eighth-grade students are provided tours of Haverhill High School facilities including the CTE programs.
- Eighth grade students have the opportunity to participate in a shadow day with an HHS CTE student. Shadow days will not be counted as unexcused absences.
- Brochures, which describe Career Technical Education programs including academic courses, and work-based learning, are distributed to all eighth students and their parents/guardians.
- Students and their Parent(s)/guardian(s) may schedule individual visits at a mutually convenient time. To request a tour, please email our CTE Office at cte@haverhill-ps.org. Transportation assistance is available upon request. If the agreed-upon time slot for a tour occurs during the applicant's school day, the CTE Office will provide confirmation to the applicant's current school that the applicant attended a tour during this time. Such tours will not be counted as unexcused absences.

VI APPLICATION PROCESS

APPLICATION PROCESS - FOR FALL ADMISSION TO THE NINTH OR TENTH GRADE PROGRAMS

1. Students interested in applying for admission to the ninth or tenth grade Career Technical Education programs for fall admission must:
 - a. Fill out the online application ([insert link to website](#)) by February 25, 2022.
 - b. Paper applications are available upon request in the student's native language through the student's middle/high school guidance counselor or the HHS CTE office. Completed paper applications need to be returned to the middle school guidance counselor or the Haverhill High School guidance counselor by February 25, 2022.
 - c. If incomplete applications are received, the following procedures will be followed:
 - i. The applicant's parent(s)/guardian(s) will be notified by mail or email by the Haverhill High School CTE Office.
 - ii. If the application remains incomplete for ten school days after notifying the parent(s)/guardian(s), the application may be voided.
2. It is the responsibility of the sending school counselor (or other school personnel, if applicable) to: fill out the guidance counselor recommendation form and supply grades, attendance and discipline records.

Sending schools will have one week from the close of applications to submit the required application information.

LATE APPLICATIONS

Applications received after the deadline will be evaluated using the same criteria as other applications and their composite score will be computed. They will be placed in rank order on a waiting list with other late applications.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

Students already enrolled in a Chapter 74 state-approved program in another school may apply for admission to Haverhill High School. Please contact the CTE Office at cte@haverhill-ps.org with any questions or to request an application form. These applications will be evaluated according to the selection criteria contained in this Admissions Policy.

WITHDRAWN STUDENTS

Students who have previously withdrawn from an HHS CTE program may reapply for admission. Please contact the CTE Office at cte@haverhill-ps.org with any questions or to request an application form. These applications will be evaluated according to the selection criteria contained in this Admissions Policy. Decisions will be based on availability of slots.

VII SELECTION PROCESS

Haverhill High School's CTE Office will examine, discuss and make recommendations for action on the applicants based on the criteria in the Admissions Policy.

The CTE Office considers academics, attendance, discipline/conduct, guidance recommendation and interview results. Applications are reviewed, processed and assigned points by grade level.

After a percentage total for each applicant has been determined, all applicants are placed in order of their "percentage total". Applicants are then accepted in order of the percentage total they have achieved. The applicant with the highest percentage total is accepted first, the applicant with the second highest percentage total is accepted second, and so on until all seats are filled. All applicants are accepted, declined, or placed on a waiting list. If openings occur, the seats are filled by accepting applicants from the waiting list. These applicants, like those accepted earlier, are accepted in order of their place on the waiting list determined by the total percentage given according to the selection criteria with preference given to resident applicants. If an acceptance is declined, admission is offered to the next applicant on the waiting list.

All applicants whose applications are received by the Haverhill High School CTE Office by the application deadline will be notified of their status by email to their parents/guardians and their local school guidance counselor by March 31, 2022.

CRITERIA

The CTE Office uses weighted admissions criteria to process completed applications. Each applicant will be assigned a score derived from the sum of the sub scores of the following criteria:

After scores are given in each area, the points will be calculated according to the weighted percentage for that area. The points are totaled for each applicant. A maximum total of one hundred (100) percent can be earned.

VIII REVIEW and APPEALS PROCESS

If Haverhill High School does not accept an applicant, or places them on a waitlist, the applicant or their parent/guardian may request within thirty days of the receipt of the rejection/waitlist letter that the Principal of Haverhill High School review that decision. These requests can be made in the following ways:

The Principal will respond to these requests for review in writing within thirty days and indicate whether the decision to deny admission to the student, or waitlist the student, will stand or be overturned. In making this determination, the Principal will review the following information:

Date the application was received, the applicant's academics, attendance, discipline/conduct, guidance recommendation and interview results. If deemed necessary the Principal will re-interview the student using the application interview questions.

IX MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS

Haverhill High School maintains records of all students who apply, enroll, or are waitlisted, as well as their score on admission criteria, to facilitate analysis of its admissions system and compliance with applicable laws and regulations. Haverhill High School will provide this information to the Department upon request.

APPLICATION PROCESS

OVERVIEW

Selective CVTE schools/programs may ask students to submit an application form. Application forms should be clear and concise, with easy-to-follow instructions, available in both English and the language of the applicant's home, and contain a notice of equal educational opportunity. CVTE schools/programs should make help available to students and families who may need assistance completing application forms.

REQUIREMENTS

APPLICATION FORM

CVTE school/program application forms should contain a **clear, step-by-step description** of how rising or current 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th (if applicable) grade students apply to the school/program, including any relevant dates and deadlines. If a school/program intends to use the same form from year to year, consider using more general timeframes for deadlines (e.g., "early fall"), but take care to clearly direct applicants to the school's calendar with more specific dates, so that students do not miss relevant deadlines.

CVTE schools/programs must provide students with an application form written in both English and the primary language of the applicant's home, if such primary language is other than English. The application form should be available in both digital and hard copy format, and should identify clear steps for students and their families to get help from the school if needed to complete an application.

Include on the form the appropriate contact at the CVTE school/program who will assist families with completing the application form where needed.

- Example: *Please contact our Admissions Office at 617-555-1234 (Admissions@CVTEschool.com) if you have questions or need help filling out the application form.*

Include on the form a notice of equal educational opportunity.

- Example: *[Name of school] admits students and makes available to them its programs, privileges, and courses of study without regard to race, color, sex, gender identity, religion, national origin, sexual orientation, or disability.*

CVTE schools/programs may include students experiencing homelessness in the equal opportunity notice above, or may include a separate statement, for example:

- Example: *[Name of school] is committed to providing educational opportunities to students experiencing homelessness. Please contact [Name of school]'s liaison at [contact email, business phone number/fax and address] with any questions.*

If parents or guardians must sign the application form, use inclusive language:

- Example: *parent/guardian* rather than *mother/father*.

Application forms should clearly state where students and families can return the completed form.

Information Requested:

Applications should only request information that is relevant to the admissions process. Examples include:

- Student's name
- Student's home address
- Name of student's current school
- Student/parent/guardian's e-mail address
- Current grade

Applications may ask applicants to **voluntarily self-identify** as a member of one or more protected classes for the purpose of monitoring the CVTE school/program's civil rights efforts. However, this section **must clearly state** that it is not mandatory and will have no bearing on the student's consideration for admission. Use inclusive language in this section to make students and their families feel welcome.

- Example: *Applicant gender: ___ Female ___ Male ___ Non-binary*

CVTE schools/programs may not request or require information from applicants concerning citizenship or immigration status.

Include in the application form a section where students with disabilities can indicate that they require reasonable accommodations to complete the admissions process, as well as the accommodations they are seeking.

Also include in the application form a section where parents/guardians may indicate that they require a translation, as well as the primary language of their home.

NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS

Not all CVTE programs approved under state law (M.G.L. c.74) are available in every district. If a student wishes to enroll in a program not available where they reside, they may apply as a non-resident to the CVTE school offering that program. However, resident students who meet the minimum requirements for admission must be admitted before the CVTE school/program admits non-residents seeking the same program.

NOTE: Students residing in cities and towns that offer an approved ninth grade exploratory program must attend the exploratory program provided by their district of residence. However, students may apply as non-residents to explore aviation maintenance technology, or specialized agriculture and natural resources programs, or concentrations therein, designated by the Commissioner, where not available in their district of residence.

In addition to applying for **admission** to the CVTE school/program, the non-resident student must also submit an application for tuition to their district of residence asking that district to pay their non-resident student **tuition**.

Specific timelines for non-resident admission are set out in [CMR 603 4.03\(6\)\(b\)](#). Here are a few important dates for students and their families:

- Non-resident students must submit an **application for admission** to the [CVTE school/program](#) by **March 15** of the school year before they wish to attend.
- Non-resident students must submit an **application for tuition** to their [district of residence](#) by **April 1** of the school year before they wish to attend.

If a district disapproves a student's application for tuition, the student's parent or guardian may request that the Department review the disapproval. The student's parent or guardian must submit this request in writing, along with any supporting documents, [to the Department](#) by **May 1** of the school year before the student wishes to attend.

What happens if a student moves after April 1?

If a student moves after April 1 to a district that is not a member of their CVTE school/program, they must submit a new tuition application to their new home district **as soon as practicable**.

The superintendent in the new district must either approve or disapprove it **within 10 school days** of receiving it. If the superintendent disapproves the tuition application, the student's parent or guardian may request that the Department review the disapproval. The student's parent or guardian must submit this request in writing, along with any supporting documents, [to the Department](#) **within 14 school days** of the disapproval.

For Receiving CVTE Schools/Programs:

CVTE schools/programs that admit non-residents **must**:

- Notify non-resident students **in writing** that their admission is program-specific and students that change programs must submit a new tuition application to their district of residence.
- Provide **the same rights and privileges** to admitted non-resident students as they provide to resident students.
 - o This includes the right to remain in the school until they complete their secondary program (unless the student moves, or changes to a new program).

- o See [603 CMR 4.03\(6\)\(b\)3.](#) for more information.

For Districts of Residence:

If a student in your district submits a tuition application to attend a CVTE school/program as a non-resident, the superintendent **must, within 10 school days:**

- Approve or disapprove that application; and
- Submit that approval or disapproval to the CVTE school/program and the student's parent/guardian.

If the superintendent disapproves the tuition application, they **must** clearly state the reason for doing so.

If your district does not offer a 9th grade exploratory program, students may apply to attend exploratory out of district.

If your district does offer an exploratory program, students may still apply to attend exploratory out of district to study aviation maintenance technology, or specialized agriculture and natural resources programs, or concentrations therein, designated by the Commissioner, and not available in your district.

Examples:

- *District A offers three Chapter 74-approved CVTE programs, but does not offer an exploratory program for 9th grade students.*
 - o *Student who lives in District A may apply to attend an exploratory program out of district.*
- *District B offers a 9th grade exploratory program that covers a range of technical programs, but not agricultural or natural resources programs.*

Student who lives in District B and wishes to study Animal Science may apply to attend an exploratory program out of district.

CONSIDERATIONS

STUDENT AND FAMILY SUPPORT

It can be difficult for families to navigate the process of applying to CVTE schools/programs. Embedding supports into the application process will help students and their families, and also help CVTE schools/programs recruit and retain strong incoming classes of students. Below are some suggestions:

- 1) Collaborate with sending/member districts to host an **application completion support night**.
At the event, families can ask clarifying questions and gain real-time support, and CVTE programs can determine if any additional materials are required.
Consider offering virtual equivalents of these events for families that may not be able to attend in-person.

- 2) Clearly explain all applicable **deadlines** and consider allowing a grace period for late applications, particularly for students with mitigating circumstances that may result in late submissions, such as those experiencing homelessness.

Also consider incorporating processes or technology that send reminders to parents/guardians and students about due dates.

- 3) Build in a process for reaching out to families if a student returns an **incomplete application form**.
- 4) If the school/program interviews student applicants, host interview **workshops**.
- 5) Examine **waitlist protocols** with an eye toward improving equal access for all students.
- 6) Solicit **feedback from the community** on the application process through surveys and discussions.

APPENDIX 1: MODEL POLICY TEMPLATE

INTRODUCTION

Massachusetts state regulations ([603 CMR 4.00](#)) require all state-funded career/vocational technical education (CVTE) schools and CVTE programs at public high schools to develop and implement admissions policies that comply with state and federal law, as well as relevant guidelines issued by the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education and the U.S. Department of Education.

To assist CVTE schools/programs as they create or revise their admissions policies, the Department has included a model policy template below. This template may help serve as a starting point; however, CVTE schools/programs should consult with their own attorneys to ensure that their policies comply with state and federal law.

I. ADMISSIONS

IF USING SELECTIVE CRITERIA

When [name of school] receives more applications than it has available seats, [name of school] applies selection criteria to determine which students it will admit. The criteria [name of school] applies have been approved by its [school committee or board of trustees], and the [school committee or board of trustees] will approve the use of these criteria annually. [Name of school]'s admission policy is on file at the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.

IF USING A LOTTERY

When [name of school] receives more applications than it has available seats, [name of school] applies a lottery to determine which students it will admit. The lottery will admit resident students before admitting any non-residents seeking the same program. [Name of school]'s admission policy is on file at the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.

II. EQUAL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY

[Name of school] admits students and makes available to them its programs, privileges, and courses of study without regard to race, color, sex, gender identity, religion, national origin, sexual orientation, or disability.

If a student's primary home language is not English, [name of school] will provide them with an application form in their home language. Please contact our Admissions Office at [phone number, email] if you have questions or need help filling out the application form.

Hybrid Regular Meeting Minutes of November 18, 2021

Roll Call - Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Wood, Vice Chair called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm and requested a roll call of the members:

Dr. Margaret Marotta, Superintendent of Schools and Mr. Michael Pfifferling, Assistant Superintendent were present in person.

Vice Chair Wood read an act relative to extending certain COVID-19 measures adopted during the state of emergency was signed by Governor Baker and allows for remote meetings and hearings by public bodies through April 1, 2022. This meeting will be available via live streaming over HCTV and WHAV. The full meeting recording will be posted on the HCTV website.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Communications/Reports.

Student Advisory Council Report ~ Hailey Prunier.

Ms. Prunier provided an update from HHS:

- Yesterday was Turkey Toss, a super fun Senior event;
- Ski Bradford is looking for instructors ages 16 and up;
- Audition for two one act plays were held today;

Ms. Prunier stated that in no way as a student did, she condone fights and other acts of violence occurring in the high school. She appreciated the Superintendent and administration's effort in conducting a parent meeting last Tuesday. Ms. Prunier encouraged more restorative actions/practices that will stop the issues at the root. She indicated that suspension or criminalization of the actions will not teach or heal the students. She noted that mental health issues, primarily from the pandemic could be alleviated through the employment of more adjustment counselors or mental health practitioners. Ms. Prunier noted that everyone should feel safe and welcomed when entering the school. She was not advocating for no consequences in violent situations.

- This upcoming Friday, a Student Faculty Forum on "A Block" will be held at the school. Ms. Prunier shared a quote that reflected the intention of this discussion: "it is not enough to listen to student voices educators have an ethical imperative to do something with students that is why meaningful student involvement is vital to school improvement."

Public Comment (In-person & Remote).

Vice Chair Wood announced in-person public comment would occur first and then remote public comment.

Ms. Carol Ireland, 5 Catalfo Road, Salem, NH, VIP Team Program Advisor, spoke about positive efforts in

our schools and commented that the focus should be changed in this situation. She stated that Haverhill was a great community with many fabulous students. Ms. Ireland reflected on the 17 years of VIP in the community and emphasized the need to work together to find solutions. She announced a Haverhill VIP event with acclaimed guest coach and speaker Michy E. Morillo, author of Cell Dreamer that will be held on Monday, November 22, 2021 from 6:00 pm – 8:00 pm at Haverhill High School.

Ms. Lori Curry, 273 Walton Road, Seabrook, NH, suggested listening to students to make them part of the solution. She referenced several efforts within the school system such as:

- working with Haverhill Police Department (youth/police dialogue) along with a continued partnership;
- diversity trainings to educate students on the appreciation of cultures and differences;
- the viewing of a film on gun violence prevention;

Ms. Curry noted the many ongoing efforts within the school system. She underscored the exhaustion factor among staff. Ms. Curry commented on magnitude of the issues and that were systemic issues and recommended finding creative resolutions including self-reflection of all parties in order to solve the problems.

Vice Chair Wood related that flexibility had been given to the first speaker, but indicated that speakers should be held to the 3-minute speaking allotment.

Ms. Viki Hernandez-Bailey, 9 Boscowen Street, Haverhill, MA, a Hillie mother and teacher revealed that the behaviors outside the classroom were extremely troubling and heartbreaking to her as an experienced teacher. She suggested that the community come together to work on the problems and recommended developing alternative methods to address the concerns. Ms. Hernandez-Bailey asked the School Committee to get more involved and visit the school more frequently to get an accurate assessment. She was alarmed by the reporting by the Eagle Tribune in which the recent violence at HHS was categorized as something that would occur in a detention center or prison. Ms. Hernandez-Bailey noted that the students needed boundaries and recommended a listening campaign (open and honest conversations or think tank). She emphasized positive solutions and ended with #nothing is stronger than a Hillie.

It was noted by the Vice Chair that Mrs. Ryan-Ciardello was attending the meeting remotely.

Mr. Barry Davis, Lowell MA stated that safety was a main concern for everyone in the schools and asked for a seat at the table. He commented that staff (HEA) were not aware of what is going on in the schools. Mr. Davis noted that diversity of student population is not reflected in the school committee, teaching staff and administration and words/actions have a different connotation (detention centers, prison and more cops) among different cultures.

Vice Chair Wood noted that Mayor Fiorentini had been in remote attendance for the duration of the meeting.

Mrs. Trish Shaw, 114 Chestnut St, Haverhill, MA, offered a personal story of severe microscopic fractures in her teeth and the resulting trauma as a outcome of an incident in an elementary school. She offered that there were irreversible effects asked how many more injuries had to occur before there is action.

Remote Public Comment

Dale Leone, 21 Race Street, Haverhill, MA, a recent graduate of HHS advocated more resources for counselors. He noted that short-term solutions would not address the root issues. Mr. Leone referenced that the community approach and applauded the student council efforts. He advocated for other solutions beside punishment.

Ms. Regina Schulman, 33 Leroy Avenue, Haverhill, MA, a long-time resident, and asked what needs were not met or what skills do students need in their life. She offered her skills to assist in the solution.

Superintendent Comments/Reports.

Update from Riverside Trauma Center - Regarding Trauma and Children's Mental Health Crisis.

Superintendent Marotta reported that this agency had been supporting the district in good times and bad times. She introduced Julia Campion, Senior Manager of Trauma Informed Care from Riverside Trauma Center. Dr. Marotta stated the struggles of students had magnified over the past two years and a revival of a sense of community needed to be brought back to Haverhill.

Ms. Campion commented that students have been struggling significantly over the past two years, resulting in depression, anxiety and trauma and are manifested in many ways. She educated professionals on traumatic events and offered examples. Ms. Campion offered extensive information on trauma (national emergency) and its massive impact on student behavior and their life. She reported that responses to trauma were different for students however, it did impact all aspects of the school experience. Ms. Campion noted that behavior is communication and trauma-related behavior communicates a need, such as, safety violations (resulting in survival/protective mode). She noted the adapted responses were either fight (aggression, irritability, anger, hyper activity or silliness) fight (isolation, avoidance, running away or freeze (intense state of stillness, or hyper vigilance). Ms. Campion related that traumatic related need is emotional resulting in connection, control or containment. She concluded that adults needed to rebuild safety for trauma-impacted students and there is the possibility of hope, healing and resilience.

Dr. Marotta commented that there needed to be a reset and that students are looking for structure, discipline with positive and supportive measures. She related that the violent videos were not representative of Haverhill High School.

Superintendent Marotta commented that both Principal Meland and Ms. Dion were present to report on the parent meeting.

Vice Chair Wood noted that this item would be combined with the following item: **Mrs. Sapienza Donais & Mrs. Ryan-Ciardello: Continued discussion of ongoing behavior issues at HHS (Principal Meland requested to attend meeting).**

Mrs. Sapienza Donais shared some email comments that she had received from parents and teachers:

- Notification of incidents;
- How can parents assist with the issue;
- Ways to speak with their children;
- Anxiety and fear while walking in the corridors (teachers);

- Security Guards need to be trained properly and have identifiable uniforms;
- Battle-fatigued teachers;
- No mediation methods;
- Joint at-risk process has not started.

Mrs. Sapienza Donais visited HHS and found the students were open and honest in their comments. She noted that students were upset that it was only 1% of the students that participated in the violent behaviors and wanted social media attention. Mrs. Sapienza Donais was impressed with the students' demeanor at the school especially in the cafeteria. She recommended transparency for parents in the area of informing parents about incidents.

Ms. Dion, Director of Guidance, Counseling and Student Support Services offered that the volume of need has increased exponentially and the number of students counselors previously seen in a week, now seeing in one day.

- **What are Counselors Seeing/Experiencing**
 - Anxiety: panic attacks, crying
 - Aggression: poor impulsive control, difficulty with self-regulation
 - Skill regression: social skills, problem-solving, distress tolerance
 - Avoidant Behaviors/Truancy
 - Increased Suicidal Ideation/Self-Harm
 - Increased hospitalization and mental health evaluation students return needing additional in-school supports due to limited community-based services
- Counselor Data (Since September 2021, school guidance counselors have tracked more than 1,500 visits to the school counseling department)
 - Individual Senior meetings
 - Individual four-year career planning with freshmen
 - Scheduling/Course Planning
 - New Student Enrollments (200 registrations this year)
 - 504 Plan Meetings
 - Classroom lessons (post-secondary planning, graduation requirements, counselor introductions)
 - Parent/Guardian Meetings (College Planning, Freshmen Night, Career Planning)
- School Adjustment Counselors tracked more than 800 points of contact with scholars and families
 - IEP group and individual counseling
 - Safety planning/individual student safety screenings
 - Family and community service provider outreach
 - Scholar referrals to community-based mental health services via e-referral system
- What to look for/what to do ~ signs and symptoms that scholars may need more support:
 - Changes in school performance
 - Changes in sleeping habits
 - Excessive worrying or fear
 - Increased irritability, anger, sadness, indifference
 - Losing interest in things they previously enjoyed
 - Intense fear of weight gain or concern with appearance

Virtual Parent Workshops will be held on Friday, November 19, 2021 and March 11, 2022 from 12:00 pm-1:30 pm (reach out to the Assistant Principal or School Counseling Office) and for those who cannot attend, a link will be sent out to parents.

Mr. Meland continued by detailing:

- What have we done at HHS?
 - Adjusted our lunch schedule
 - Increased supervision in hallways, bathrooms, cafeteria

- Increased hall sweeps and tardiness interventions
- Reopened bathrooms to limit travel time and crowding
- Engaged staff and students in listening session to elicit feedback and collaboratively plan solutions
- Added 1 SRO, added 2 Student Support Coordinators
- Added capacity to Night School
- Referrals to Night School, Gateway Program and alternative placements
- Added district-wide position for Director of Guidance, Counseling, and Student Support Services
- Filled district-wide Safe and Supportive Schools Liaison position
- Received \$10,000 Safe and Supportive Schools Grant
- Upgrading Security System at HHS
- Added vape/motion detectors to all bathrooms at HHS
- Ongoing PD to staff around social-emotional learning practices in classrooms
- What are we planning to do at HHS?
 - Implement DeansList to manage behavior referrals, data tracking, and interventions
 - Implement a hall pass system update to limit traffic in hallways during classes
 - Increase capacity and build Gateway Program into full-fledged alternative school
 - Build community and trust by holding healing conversations with scholars in classes
 - Bring in guest speakers supporting positive school climate and culture and planning for their future

Superintendent Marotta was requesting that the School Committee approve budget transfers (budget neutral) to hire the following positions along with a calendar adjustment:

- 2 School Adjustment Counselors at HHS
- 2 Security Guards at HHS
- 1 SRO at MS level
- Adjust calendar to add ½ day PD time for all schools.

Attorney Magliocchetti thanked Mr. Meland for the presentation. He stated that there were 2,000 students with eight (8) guidance counselors and five (5) adjustment counselors and stressed the enormous caseload for these staff members. Attorney Magliocchetti recommended collaborative work with all stakeholders and supported the additional professional development, and the expansion of alternative school options. He inquired about participation data on afterschool programs at Whittier Regional and its role with development of skill sets. Additionally, Attorney Magliocchetti noted the importance of the Early College Program.

Attorney Magliocchetti asked Police Chief Pistone about the role of the SRO. Chief Pistone reported on the SRO and highlighted two SRO's Officer Christian Guzman, a Latino male (HHS) and Officer Milady Figueroa, Latino female (Consentino). The Chief gave examples of SRO contribution in our schools and they are a resource for the schools and provide a safe environment along with being role models. He related that SROs cannot be a disciplinarian, enforcer or used in the place of school counselors unless there is evidence of criminal misconduct. Chief Pistone detailed the legal role of the police in the schools and noted the police in the schools are mentors.

Attorney Magliocchetti indicated that police presence was not allowed to be used at the school as a

militant presence. He applauded Chief Pistone for transforming the police department.

Mayor Fiorentini asked what can we learn from the 98% of students who are not involved in these behaviors.

Superintendent Marotta answered that all school districts are dealing with these behaviors and it was unusual year.

Ms. Sullivan replied that the students want to attend the vocational school and it was a different system. She was tired of the blame and noted that there were many reasons for bad behavior and there needed to be an understanding of the reasons.

Mayor Fiorentini asked about any best practices to help minimize the incidents.

Dr. Marotta suggested that looking at what the behavior says about the student is a priority.

Mayor Fiorentini asked about discipline solutions.

Superintendent Marotta identified a restorative justice program at the YMCA in Beverly where supports for the students and parents are provided in a separate setting (intensive supports and therapeutic interventions). She replied that the program was very successful and it would be a good addition for Haverhill. The Superintendent commented that suspension along was not the answer.

In response to the mayor's question on alternative schools, Dr. Marotta suggested expanding the opportunities (more options for students who did not function well in a 2,000-student environment) and provided the criteria for admittance to the Gateway Program.

Mayor Fiorentini asked about collaboration with the Phoenix Charter School in Lawrence and Dr. Marotta answered about a dozen students were enrolled in that school setting.

The mayor stated it was not helpful to state the behaviors were similar to those in a prison setting.

Attorney Rosa commented that you do not have to choose between school resource officers and school adjustment counselors. He asked about staff that were trained as youth mental health first aid instructors.

Ms. Dion related that in early January 2022, the district would hear about grant funding for youth mental health first aid instructors and noted that at present there were 13 trained staff. She stated a grant had recently been submitted for 18 youth mental health first aid certification courses (total 270 staff members) and the notification would be in early January 2022.

Attorney Rosa asked about Lesley University's trauma training (70-80 staff).

Superintendent Marotta answered the courses were graduate level and she was unclear about the specific components.

Attorney Rosa inquired about other discipline issues in our other schools and age-appropriate discipline

such as removal of recess.

Dr. Marotta answered the removal of recess was not a good discipline measure and was a counterproductive practice.

Attorney Rosa asked about consequences for behaviors.

Dr. Marotta provided some examples of discipline such as interventions, supports and consequences.

Attorney Rosa noted the PBIS program in our schools. He also suggested the adaption of restorative justice to lower grades.

Superintendent Marotta answered that restorative justice could be translated to the elementary grades (adapted to age/development level and making reparations/amends to community).

Attorney Rosa referenced several students commented that they had not met their guidance counselor and the lack of outreach to students. He highlighted the caseload amounts that were carried by our guidance counselors. Attorney Rosa noted the perception of students wanting to be social media stars by participating in these bad behaviors. He suggested the punishment of taking away cell phones (since that would have a significant impact).

Principal Meland explained that cell phones were a part of student culture (digital natives) and there were some mitigation efforts used in certain cases.

Attorney Rosa commented on the length and timeliness of disciplinary process.

Mr. Meland reported that the technology issue was being implemented to assist in the discipline procedure and there was a tight timeline for the launch.

Mrs. Sapienza Donais supported professional development for staff. She asked about ways to inform parents on discipline incidents.

Mr. Meland referenced the parent meeting recently held this week. He explained the discipline process including identifying root causes, notifications, and hearings. Principal Meland stated that it can be a lengthy process, however, sometimes social media and the media report the information before the parent notification.

Attorney Rosa asked for the school to have time to formulate the procedures.

Mrs. Sapienza Donais asked for the School Committee to be included in the emails to parents.

Mayor Fiorentini asked about the removal of cell phones for discipline matters, such as videotaping a fight.

Superintendent Marotta commented that there was no policy.

Attorney Rosa suggested consultation with administrators and teachers on how to implement the policy.

Principal Meland asked for time to obtain feedback from staff.

Mayor Fiorentini wanted immediate action on this matter.

Attorney Rosa suggested that the school would determine length of time and implementation.

Mayor Fiorentini accepted the friendly amendment.

A motion was made by Attorney Magliocchetti to remove a student's cell phone for discipline issues (the length and process of cell phone removal be determined by school officials). Mayor Fiorentini seconded the motion. Vice Chair Wood requested a roll call vote:
