SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER

A MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS DR. MARGARET MAROTTA

Dear Students, Families, and Staff,

Our schools have been in session for close to two months now, and the impact of COVID-19 on our children is evident. While the school district continues to experience positive cases of COVID-19 and the Delta variant, the impact that I am referring to is the emotional impact of the pandemic. The pandemic has caused disruptions in routines and social isolation for all children, which can be associated with anxiety and depression and can have implications for mental health now and later in life.

While we don't yet know the full extent of the trauma inflicted upon our children by the pandemic, it is very clear that this school year far more students are showing evidence of trauma. Trauma is often expressed through increased anxiety, fear, sadness or worry, as well as anger, behavioral outbursts, and mood swings, some children become withdrawn or confused. When children and young people are struggling to cope with stress, they may exhibit unhealthy eating or sleeping habits, changes in activity level, older students may exhibit substance use or other risk behaviors, and difficulty with attention and concentration.

To help keep your child emotionally health experts recommend:

- Keeping a regular sleep schedule
- Taking breaks from work to stretch, exercise
- Frequent check-ins with supportive adults
- Spending time outdoors, either being physically active or relaxing.
- Monitoring use of social media sites

As a school district we want to partner with you in your child's education and mental health. We knew the return to school this year would be a challenge, educationally and emotionally. This school year we have added dozens of academic and mental health support positions to our schools. We have trained 150 professionals in Mental Health First Aid, and provided a full-time aid in each Kindergarten classroom — as many of our K students have no preschool experience. We have created a network of community mental health supports that work with our students in our schools, and we have student support teams in each school that proactively support attendance, physical and mental health, as well as academic needs. Please do not wait until the situation reaches a crisis point for we have people available to support your family. Please reach out to your school if you have questions or need support with your child.

Like so many businesses and organizations, the district is faced with staff shortages, especially with Educational Support Professionals (starting pay is \$21.00 an hour) and Substitute Teachers (long- and short-term - pay range is \$94.50 - \$125.00 a day) who work directly to support students and work closely with teachers. If you would like to work in a rewarding position making a difference in the lives of children, contact the Human Resource Department (call **978-374-3411**). There are both full- and part-time positions available.

Thank you for all you do to support your child's teacher, class, school, and our District. It means a lot to us as we partner to meet the daily needs of our students and families.

PENTUCKET LAKE ELEMENTARY

Pentucket Lake Elementary has a new Physical Education teacher, Ms. Arielle Hall! Even though she is brand new to Pentucket Lake, Ms. Hall is not new to a lot of her Pentucket Lake students. Over the summer, Ms. Hall worked at the YMCA and got to know so many of the students who attend Pentucket Lake. Her summer YMCA students as well as her new friends are so excited to be a part of her class.

To get the school year started, Ms. Hall celebrated Hispanic Heritage Month by playing a modified version of a popular Hispanic table game called Lotería. Lotería is a lot like bingo except it uses pictures and Spanish phrases instead of letter-number combinations on the cards. The students will be playing on large cards with traditional Lotería pictures on the front and exercises on the back. When a picture on their board gets called, they flip the card over and do the associated exercises. The first team to have a full row of pictures is the winner!

Ms. Hall's goal at Pentucket Lake is to create an environment that encourages the students to enjoy and understand the importance of living a physically active lifestyle while celebrating the diversity of Pentucket Lake and Haverhill. CONSENTINO BACK - TO - SCHOOL BBQ

Consentino Middle School hosted its second annual Back to School BBQ on September 21st. The event which welcomed over 1,000 students and family members included a BBQ dinner, Kona Ice, Tug-o-War, face painting, Math game table and more.

Additionally, the Consentino Counseling Team together with the National Junior Honor Society chapter hosted the 2nd Annual Fall Fill-A-Truck event where more than two pickup truck loads of non-perishable food and personal hygiene items were collected to support the school's Backpack 68 program. The Backpack 68 program is a student support program that discreetly provides students in need with a Backpack full of food and personal hygiene items to assist in getting students by for the roughly 68 hours between dismissal on Friday and breakfast at school on Monday.

The school also welcomed Dore + Whittier, the architectural firm selected to oversee the school's building project. Representatives from Dore + Whitter solicited feedback from staff, students, and families for what they like about the existing Consentino and what they'd like to see in a renovated or new building.

Overall, the event was a smashing success and the Charger Nation is looking forward to a great year!

COVID-19 Safety Check Testing Starts This Week

Haverhill Public Schools will again be offering routine COVID Safety check testing weekly in our schools. This is a quick and easy lower nasal swab, which will be sent out as a group for testing. If the sample tests positive, individuals will be tested separately to determine if there is a positive case of COVID-19. By testing students and staff weekly, including those who are unvaccinated and vaccinated, we will increase the likelihood of preventing spread especially from individuals who are asymptomatic.

Additionally, Haverhill is participating in a new program from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) and Massachusetts Department of Public Health, called "Test and Stay". If an individual in school, who is unvaccinated, and is considered a school close contact, then the individual may be eligible to continue to come to school during their quarantine period and be tested at school using the Abbott Binax Antigen test daily for 5 days in school.

Parent permission will be required and information on providing permission for routine COVID Safety check testing, and the use of the Abbott Binax test, can be found in one consent form.

THE CONSENTINO BUILDING PROJECT

The Consentino School Building Project is underway! The city of Haverhill is collaborating with the Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) on the Consentino School Building Project. The MSBA works in partnership with local communities to fund the building and remodeling of fiscally responsible and educationally appropriate schools. The MSBA is a quasi-public authority that provides construction management, financial, audit, and administrative expertise to support the Commonwealth's school districts throughout the school building construction process.

The MSBA has established the following 8 Modules to help Districts understand and complete the school building process:

Module 1 – Pre-Requisites

The MSBA requires the District to submit various information, including but not limited to: funding capacity information, existing maintenance practices, and design enrollment certification.

Module 2 – Project Team

The MSBA requires the District to hire an Owner's Project Manager and a design team utilizing MSBA standard templates and contracts.

Module 3 – Feasibility Study – Current Consentino Building Project Phase

During this phase, the District, Owner's Project Manager, and design team document the educational program, create a space summary, document existing conditions, establish design parameters, and develop and evaluate alternatives. The group will then recommend the most educationally appropriate preferred solution to the MSBA Board of Directors for their consideration.

Module 4 - Schematic Design

During this phase, the District and its team develop a final design program and robust schematic design.

Module 5 – Project Scope and Budget

At this point in the process, the MSBA Board of Directors establishes the MSBA's financial participation in the project.

Module 6 – Design Development, Construction Documentation, and Bidding

The District and its team advance the design, generate construction documentation, procure bids and award a construction contract.

Module 7 – Construction Administration

The MSBA continues to monitor the project's progress to confirm that it remains on track and meets project expectations.

Module 8 – Project Closeout

The MSBA performs an audit to determine the final total grant amounts and make the final payment.

The proposed project will replace or remodel the existing Consentino Middle School with a facility on the current site. The District identified in their Statement of Interest many deficiencies and structural integrity issues, including mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems. In addition to the physical plan issues, the District reported that the existing facility is overcrowded and does not support the delivery of its educational program.

A series of public visioning meetings exploring the design and amenities prioritized by community members, students, and staff will kick off with a Visioning Session on December 8, 2021 at 6:00pm.
