A Message from the Supervisor of Attendance Lorna Marchant, M.S., M.Ed

Haverhill Public Schools stands with the nation in recognizing September as "Attendance Awareness Month." We hereby commit to focusing on reducing absenteeism and addressing the factors that cause students to miss school to ensure all children an equitable opportunity to learn, grow and thrive academically, emotionally, and socially. We recognize that we must work together to engage students and families.

### Specifically, we will:

- 1. Affirm the importance of showing up and reflect with students and families on what is needed to make showing up to school worthwhile, especially given the challenges experienced during the pandemic.
- 2. Make clear that improving student attendance, including taking daily attendance in a consistent manner and monitoring absenteeism, continues to be a top priority.
- 3. Engage students, families, educators, and the broader community including civic and elected leaders, local businesses, clergy members and nonprofit organizations in working together to identify and remove barriers to getting to school and develop meaningful solutions that ensure all children and youth keep learning despite the challenges of Covid-19.
- 4. Use chronic absence data, along with other indicators, to identify where the instructional losses are occurring, and invest additional resources in schools and school-related programs, including tutoring, expanded learning, community school strategies and health services.

Throughout the month of September our schools will be celebrating our students as they develop the habit of good attendance. Please join us this month and every month to ensure your child attends today so that they can achieve tomorrow.
