Our Community



Haverhill, on the banks of the Merrimack River, is a New England city of over 67,000 people located in the northeastern quadrant of Massachusetts on the border of southeastern New Hampshire. Haverhill is just 35 miles north of Boston with a 60 minute rail service access. It is conveniently located near the seacoast and New England's ski country. Originally settled as Pentucket in 1640, Haverhill was incorporated as a city in 1870. The city is governed by a Mayor and Council and provides a spectrum of municipal services. A community college and 1100 industries and businesses give Haverhill a stable employment and tax base.

Haverhill has a unique downtown sector, the Washington Street Historic District, which contains one of the finest concentrations of Queen Anne industrial architecture in America. The district includes 45 buildings of decorative brickwork and ornamental cast iron columns that now house fine dining, cultural exhibits, shops, and boutiques. The Haverhill Stadium and Winnekenni Park provide over 250 acres of recreational, social, and cultural activities. Public golf courses, a boardwalk and rail trail, a ski area, health centers, fitness facilities, and a museum provide recreational and social outlets for Haverhill residents.

The city is proud of its extensive ethnic diversity stemming from past and recent immigration. Haverhill has a fine health care facility, a rehabilitation center, and is less than an hour drive from Boston's major teaching and research hospitals. Haverhill is a city that has rejuvenated itself, diversified its economic/employment base and is reaping the benefits of people working together to make it a better place to live.

The Haverhill Public Schools

Haverhill has a student population of 7,800, which is projected for moderate growth over the next several years. The city's students are housed at a high school for grades 9-12, one elementary and middle school grades K-8, three middle schools, six elementary schools, two Early Childhood Centers (Pre-School), two Alternative schools and a Therapeutic Education Assessment Center.

The Family Resource and Registration Center at Burnham was established to make a smooth transition for parents and students into the Haverhill Public Schools. This school building was converted into offices in 2008 and it houses the Registration Center for Grades PreK-12, Discovery/Access 21, Homeless Liaison, Health and Nursing Services, Student Attendance, Transportation, Title I and Community Outreach, and our Multilingual Learner Departments.

The Haverhill Public Schools has over 950 volunteers and an extensive business-education partnership program that promotes community involvement and pride in the schools. The school system currently employs over 1900 professional and support staff and has an operating budget of \$119 million. It also receives an additional \$12 million in Federal and State Grants and other revenues.

Haverhill High School offers advanced placement courses, six foreign languages programs, Early College program partnered with Northern Essex Community College, a Classical Academy, Business Academy, Fine Arts Academy, Humanities Academy, STEM Academy, NAF Academy of Information Technology (CTVE) Program, Programming and Web Development (CVTE) Program, Healthcare Occupations (CTE) Program and Marine Corps JROTC Program. Haverhill High School sponsors a broad-based athletics program, offering 35 sports programs and fielding over 57 different teams.
