NHD is a regional, state, and national history research competition that centers around an annual historical theme.

Students spend five months extensively researching, writing, and preparing their project to present before judges.

This is a program that fosters deep critical thinking skills



## What are National History Day "Themes?"




An NHD theme is a focal point in which students center there ideas and ultimately their thesis statements around their research topic.

## How many students partake each year?




On average over 6,000 students in Massachusetts high schools participate each year.

In 2025, this past year, there has been a 37% increase in participation across the state.
